

This Indenture Witnesseth That

Arthur R. Wright of  
doth put himself Apprentice to Joseph George  
Morley, Manufacturer & Harp-maker of  
to learn his Art; and with him (after the Manner of an Apprentice) to serve from the  
first day of November - 1891 - until the full End and Term of ~~three years and nine months~~ <sup>three years and nine months</sup> from thence next following, to

be fully complete and ended. During which Term, the said Apprentice his said Master faithfully shall serve, his Secrets  
keep, his lawful Commands every where gladly do. He shall do no Damage to his said Master nor see it to be done  
of Others; but that he to his Power shall let, or forthwith give warning to his said Master of the same. He shall  
not waste the Goods of his said Master, nor lend them unlawfully to any. He shall not play at Cards, Dice,  
Tables, or any other unlawful Games, whereby his said Master may have any Loss. With his own Goods or  
Others, during the said Term, without Licence of his said Master, he shall neither buy nor sell. He shall not  
haunt Taverns or Playhouses, nor absent himself from his said Master's Service Day nor Night unlawfully. But in  
all things, as a faithful Apprentice, he shall behave himself towards his said Master, and all his, during the  
said Term. And the said Master doth for himself, his heirs and assigns  
with George Edward Wright - Brother of the said  
Arthur R. Wright - to accept and take the said  
Arthur R. Wright as his apprentice for the term  
of three years and nine months from the first  
Day of November 1891 and will to the best of his  
Knowledge, teach and instruct; or cause to be taught  
and instructed in  
his said Apprentice, in the Art of Manufacturing Harps, which he useth, by the best Means  
that he can, shall teach and instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed; finding unto his said Apprentice  
Necessaries, during the said Term Lodging, and all other

Sum of fifteen shillings per week  
for the first year, and seventeen  
shillings for the remainder of the  
term - Fifty two hours of work per week

And for the true Performance of all and every the said Covenants and Agreements, either of the said Parties  
bindeth himself unto the other by these Presents. In Witness, whereof the parties above named to these
